

Arizona Forward's 41st Annual Environmental Excellence Awards, Presented in Partnership with SRP Celebrates Sustainability in Arizona

April 29th, 2023, | Scottsdale, AZ: More than 500 business and community leaders, elected officials, and their guests gathered on April 29th 2023, at the JW Marriott Scottsdale Camelback Inn Resort & Spa in anticipation to hear who the recipients would be for this prestigious Arizona Forward Environmental Excellence awards presented by SRP. SRP's partnership on the program truly demonstrates their commitment to a more sustainable Arizona. Mayors, CEOs, project team members and their partners were excited to receive these prestigious awards and celebrate their achievements with the community.

At the end of the evening, an award is given to the project that the judges ranked the highest, which was the **Urban Heat Leadership Academy.** Anna Bettis and other members of The Nature Conservancy and their partner, The Phoenix Revitalization Group, were present to accept the award for the **President's Award**, the top honor of all project submissions.

"The award winners, as well as all finalists, were remarkable again this year. It was so inspiring to see projects from throughout the state which are making Arizona a more sustainable state for us all to live, work and play", said Lori Singleton, President and CEO. "Additionally, to commemorate Arizona Forward's 50th Anniversary, two special awards were given to Intel Corporation and U-Haul for their longstanding commitment to environmental stewardship, as their impact spans many of the categories in the awards program and demonstrates both a historical and future commitment to sustainability.
