UARIZONA, STATE OF ARIZONA EXPAND ELIGIBILITY FOR COVID-19 ANTIBODY TESTING



Following a significant increase in the number of Arizonans who have been exposed to COVID-19, the University of Arizona and state of Arizona are expanding their free COVID-19 antibody testing program for 250,000 people across the state to include 15 new categories of essential workers considered at high risk for exposure.

The antibody test, developed by researchers at UArizona Health Sciences, determines who has been exposed to and developed an immune response against COVID-19. To learn more about the antibody testing program click here. More information and registration for the test is available at

The following essential workers, in addition to workers in eight other employment categories, are now eligible for antibody testing under the program:

- Educators
- Childcare workers
- Agriculture, grocery, and food service workers
- Hospitality employees
- Solid waste collection workers
- Transportation services workers
- Members of the National Guard

Household Hazardous Waste Alternatives



The Public Works Department now offers alternatives for the disposal of <u>household hazardous waste</u> <u>materials</u> in lieu of the city events canceled due to COVID-19. Household hazardous waste can now be dropped off at a few specific locations, depending on the waste items. Drop-Offs will be available for Phoenix residents until the end of August and the <u>HHW Alternatives Flyer</u> provides more information on drop-off sites and scheduling.

Information on household hazardous waste events in the fall should be available by late August. Public Works Staff is currently evaluating logistics of the events based on the state and city's re-opening guidelines. PHOENIX SKY HARBOR

Giant Robots Arrive at Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport



A family of towering, 10-foot tall robots have taken over Phoenix Airport Museum's Terminal 4 Gallery at Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. Mother, father, and a child robot stand in an athletic pose with arms raised nearly touching the ceiling. Their heads, appendages and torsos consist of televisions, blitzing with fast-paced video clips of sports highlights, popular culture and desert imagery.

The robot figures are part of an intriguing

technology-based sculptural installation by the "Father of Video Art," **Nam June Paik** (1932 – 2006). Titled *Electro-Symbio Phonics for Phoenix*, the artwork was originally commissioned for Phoenix's new America West Arena (now Talking Stick Resort Arena) in 1992. The robots stood along the doorways leading to the arena from the food court, only to be removed during renovations in 2002. Southbound I-17 closed this weekend between Thunderbird Road and Dunlap Avenue for pavement work

The Arizona Department of Transportation advises drivers to plan ahead for a weekend closure of southbound Interstate 17 between Thunderbird Road and Dunlap Avenue for pavement maintenance. Drivers should expect heavy travel delays and use alternate routes to avoid the closure area.

- Southbound I-17 will be closed between Thunderbird Road and Dunlap Avenue from 2 a.m. Saturday, August 1, to 5 a.m. Monday, August 3.
- The southbound I-17 on-ramps at Greenway, Thunderbird and Cactus roads and Peoria Avenue will also be closed.
- Detours: Southbound travelers can use 35th Avenue or 19th Avenue.

This is the final planned weekend closure for pavement maintenance on I-17 between Thunderbird Road and Dunlap Avenue.

ADOT advises drivers to slow down and use caution around construction personnel and equipment while the maintenance work is underway. I-17 restrictions scheduled near Carefree Highway in north Phoenix

Interstate 17 is scheduled to be narrowed at times near Carefree Highway in north Phoenix during the week of Aug. 3-7 for Arizona Department of Transportation maintenance work.

- Northbound I-17 narrowed to one lane near Carefree Highway from 5 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday, Aug. 3, for pavement repairs. Northbound I-17 on-ramp at Dove Valley Road closed.
- I-17 narrowed to one or two lanes at times in either direction overnight near Pioneer Road from 9 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 4, to 5 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 5, for a scheduled bridge inspection.

Drivers should allow extra travel time and use caution when approaching and traveling through the work zones. Always stay alert for highway crews and equipment. Schedules are subject to change due to inclement weather or other factors. 

CACTUS PARK WEST NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION SAYS GOODBYE


"Dedicated FOR 28 YEARS to the Sharing of News and Information Concerning our Neighborhood, Schools and Community"


