Phoenix Fire Department Fire Station 55 Building Design Review





CITY OF PHOENIX BOOSTS SALT AND VERDE ALLIANCE

Ensuring Reliable, Clean Water Supplies for Three Million People in the Valley

The Phoenix City Council has approved a three-year partnership with The Nature Conservancy aimed at protecting flows and improving water quality in the Salt and Verde Rivers.

Through this partnership, Phoenix will join and invest \$100,000 per year in the Salt and Verde Alliance: *Healthy Rivers, Healthy Communities*. Phoenix was the first municipality to support the Alliance with a multi-year investment.

The Nature Conservancy, a leading conservation organization working to protect important lands and waters for both people and nature, convened a historic meeting of fourteen rivershed communities in 2016 that led to the creation of the Salt and Verde Alliance. The Alliance serves as a way for communities, corporations and foundations to invest in river-friendly projects that improve watershed protection, the quantity of flow and the quality of water in the Salt and Verde Rivers.

"A reliable water supply is critical to public health and economic prosperity in Phoenix," said Mayor Thelda Williams. "By protecting and improving our watersheds, the Salt and Verde Alliance Fund aides long-term water security. Phoenix is proud to lead the way as the first municipality to partner with The Nature Conservancy on this fund."

"We appreciate that Phoenix took the lead in helping us create collective action around the protection of the Salt and Verde Rivers," said Pat Graham, State Director, The Nature Conservancy in Arizona. "The extended drought has seen river flows decline by thirty-five percent. The time to act is now. Healthy rivers are essential to a healthy economy as well as countless benefits to people such as clean water and air, food security and beautiful places we enjoy."

The Salt and Verde River watersheds encompass 13,000 square miles in the eastern and north central portions of Arizona. These watersheds feed The Salt and Verde Rivers, which are vital surface water supplies to downstream users in the greater Phoenix metropolitan areas. The City of Phoenix obtains more than one-half of its raw water supply from these rivers.

Since its inception, the Salt and Verde Alliance has completed several projects, including:

- Thinning 1,600 acres of forests across four project areas within the Kaibab National and Coconino National Forest to reduce wildfire risk in the Verde watershed.
- Increasing water supply by approximately 40,150 acre-feet in the Verde River by implementing projects that benefit local farmers, create water savings, improve water quality and management and reduce future river impacts.

Over the next 3 years, the Alliance aims to thin an additional 12,000 acres of forest and increase water supply through infrastructure improvements.

PHOENIX TO HOST 2024 NCAA MEN'S FINAL FOUR



Phoenix will be the site of the 2024 the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Final Four, marking the second Final Four in the city's history. This will be the seventh time the Phoenix/Glendale area has hosted the tournament, with the last time being the 2017 Final Four, when North Carolina edged Gonzaga for the championship after losing in the title game in heartbreaking fashion the prior season. This will be just the second Final Four to take place in the western part of the country since 1995.

"We are thrilled for the opportunity to host another successful Final Four. In 2017, City of Phoenix staff, public safety officials, and community leaders came together to produce an exceptional-and safe-experience for college basketball fans. We are grateful to the NCAA for again selecting Phoenix to host an event that brought an economic and tourism boost to our region," said Phoenix Mayor Thelda Williams.

SOUTHBOUND INTERSTATE 17 FRONTAGE ROAD TO BE RESTRICTED IN NORTH PHOENIX

Drivers who use the southbound Interstate 17 frontage road in north Phoenix should consider an alternate route this Friday while crews locate underground utilities.

Nearly a mile of the southbound I-17 frontage road will be narrowed to one lane between Thunderbird and Cactus roads from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday, July 20. Motorists should plan for possible delays. The I-17 mainline will not be affected.

This week's utility locating work is occurring as the Arizona Department of Transportation prepares for a large-scale drainage improvement project along I-17 in north Phoenix. The project, scheduled to begin in 2019, aims to reduce the potential for flooding along the I-17 corridor during heavy rains by improving drainage facilities at the cross-street underpasses at Greenway, Thunderbird and Cactus Roads and Peoria Avenue. August 11th is National 811 Day – the perfect day to remind you to always call before you dig! Have you ever wondered what the different colored markings on roads or in yards are? They're a sign that a contractor or homeowner has put safety first and had utility lines identified prior to excavation.

Utility lines that serve the community with vital services such as natural gas, electricity, sewer and water can be buried anywhere. Striking a utility line not only poses a safety risk, but can also cause an interruption of service to customers.

A+ Schools of Excellence

The Arizona Educational Foundation has announced the 2018 A+ Schools of Excellence including five Deer Valley schools. The DVUSD Governing Board recognized the five schools for their superior ability to identify and meet the academic and non-academic needs of their students.

Constitution Elementary School - In the past three years, Constitution moved from a C to an A- rated school, which puts it in the top 16% of schools in the state. AzMerit scores showed Constitution was second in growth in Deer Valley.

Sierra Verde - One of Sierra Verde's main strengths is the vision of its leadership. High expectations and shared leadership style are the driving force, which moves the school continually forward, never for a moment resting on its past accolades.

Deer Valley High School – Deer Valley is a community that values excellence. In the past three years, graduation rates have increased 4% with 95% of seniors graduating in 2016. Deer Valley embraces their "family" culture where they have graduated multiple generations over the years.

Mountain Ridge High School – Each Mountain Ridge teacher selects a minimum of five students and intentionally connects with them over the year, setting goals, providing additional support, reviewing grades, and getting to know them better. The proven results have quantified this as an effective strategy to promote learning through social-emotional support.

Sandra Day O'Connor High School – The caring and passionate SDOHS administration and staff have worked tirelessly to provide the tools necessary to commission students to not only be academically strong, but to learn how to be self-motivated, to problem-solve, and to interface in a highly technical and everchanging world.
