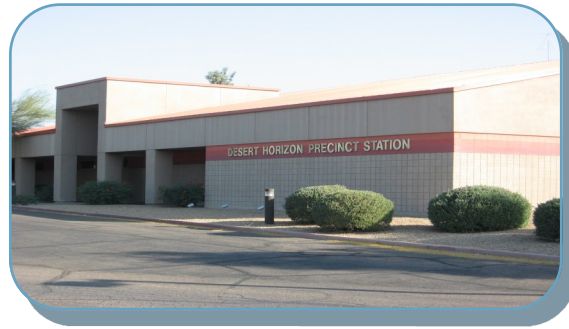

On September 6, 2021, officers responded to an aggravated robbery that occurred in the area of 12th St and Campbell. Information was received that two suspects approached the victim, physically assaulted him, and threatened him with an unknown object. The suspects took the victim's bike by force and departed in a pickup truck. Officer Miller located the truck in the area of 17th St and Indian School, which was found to be an outstanding stolen vehicle listed by Mesa Police Department. Officer Miller provided updates and direction of travel while waiting for additional units and the Air Unit.

The suspect vehicle turned eastbound on Indianola and came to a dead end in an apartment complex parking lot. Officers Miller, Heigel, Anchondo, and several other officers conducted a high risk stop at the location, where the two suspects were detained without incident. The victim's bike was found in the back of the truck. Officer Leeper obtained a story from the victim and transported him to conduct one on one identifications with both suspects. The victim positively identified the suspects and the suspect truck.

Officer Anchondo interviewed the suspect driver, who admitted he and the passenger believed the bike belonged to them and attempted to get the bike back. During the process of taking the bike, he realized it was not his but continued to take the victim's bike by force. The driver was found to have methamphetamines in his pocket.

Officer Heigel interviewed the passenger who advised he observed the victim with the bike and believed the bike belonged to the driver. He admitted to being with the driver when he used force to take the bike but would not admit to physically assaulting or threatening the victim with an unknown item. The passenger suspect was found to have a BOLO. Homicide was contacted and requested Officer Heigel obtain biographical information for follow-up at a later time. The suspects were charged with Aggravated Robbery, Theft of Means of Transportation and Possession of Dangerous Drugs.

I would like to commend Officers Leeper, Heigel and Anchondo for working together to apprehend two violent felons. The hard work and dedication to duty by these officers is consistent with the high standards and guiding values of the Phoenix Police Department.

Great JOB!

Recently, our NET (Neighborhood Enforcement Team) became aware of an active dealer operating in the precinct. A traffic stop was conducted after surveillance revealed several possible deals. Evidence of drug sales were found in the vehicle. The suspect was then booked for the possession and sale of dangerous drugs.

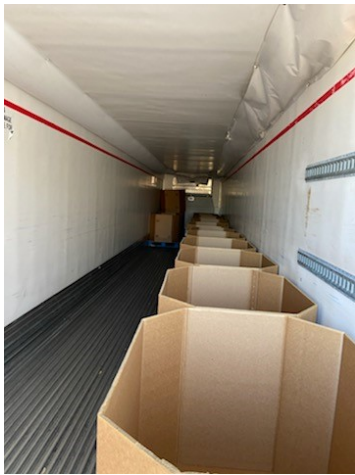
Officers were able to seize approximately 3,870 Fentanyl Pills, 14 ounces of Heroin, five ounces of Methamphetamine, and \$6,870 in cash!

Our NET Team executed a great plan and were successful! Thank you for all your hard work and getting these drugs and criminals off the streets!

It remains one of the of the airport's best kept secrets, because it can be easily reached from highways and major streets; it has a Cell Phone Lot; and you can access both terminals using the 24-hour PHX Sky Train®.

The station is ideal for dropping off or picking up passengers.

Some other tips to consider:

If you're planning to park at the airport, book your parking ahead of time with [Sky Harbor Discount Parking](#) to save time and money. Our parking options provide you with the most convenient access to the terminals.

Check your flight status and security checkpoint wait times before arriving at the airport. Flight status can be checked with your airline and security checkpoint wait times are available on the homepage of skyharbor.com and on the flight information displays at the airport once you arrive.

Lastly, be sure to give yourself plenty of time. Plan to arrive at least two hours prior to your departure time and be sure to bring a face covering. Travelers are required to wear a face covering inside all airport facilities including the rental car shuttle buses.

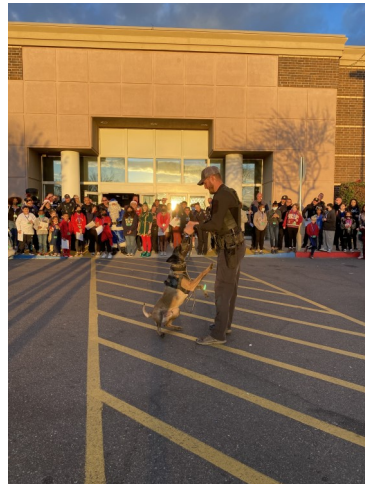


Shop with a Cop
